The Library now contains over 21,000 volumes, among which are: the published reports of federal and state courts and the courts of Great Britain, the federal statutes, most of the recent statutes of the various states, the leading law journals, carefully selected treatises and text books, and considerable amount of material on administrative law, including the reports of the Board of Tax Appeals and the Tax Court, the opinions of the National Labor Relations Board, the Prentice-Hall Labor Service, and CCH Aviation Law Service.

The Library is open during the week from 8:00 A.M. to 5:30 P.M. and from 7:30 P.M. to 10:30 P.M., on Saturdays from 9:00 A.M. to 12:30 P.M. and from 2:00 P.M. to 5:00 P.M., and on Sundays from 2:00 P.M. to 5:00 P. M. The Law Librarian, Mr. James C. Rehberg, is a lawyer and a member of the Georgia Bar as well as a qualified librarian. He will be glad to help you locate books in this library or to obtain from other law libraries books available on a loan basis.

The Walter F. George School of Law (formerly Mercer Law School) has been a member of the Association of American Law Schools since 1923 and has been approved by the American Bar Association since 1925.

Minimum requirements for admission:

Completion in residence of one-half the college work acceptable for the A.B. degree at a college or university of recognized standing. Enrollment in the Law School is limited to 150 students to insure adequate faculty supervision of each student. Preference is given applicants on the basis of the quality of their college work, the amount of college work successfully completed in excess of minimum admission requirements, and their general fitness for the study of law.
